

PEDICULOSIS (LICE) REMINDER

- The York Catholic District School Board recognizes concerns related to pediculosis (head lice) at the school and community level.
- Pediculosis is not a public hazard, as they do not cause illness, but they are a nuisance.
- To prevent pediculosis (head lice) from becoming a problem at our school we all need to work together. Please check your child's head on a regular basis for lice or nits.
- If you do find lice or nits, you must contact the office so that we can notify your child's class to keep a special watch for any signs of head lice.
- A student's readmission to school is contingent upon the parent/guardian submitting a completed and signed "Pediculosis Treatment Form" and communicating to the principal that treatment for pediculosis (head lice) has been administered.



ALLERGY POLICY REMINDER

- Our school is an allergy-safe school and as such we ask parents to be diligent when sending food and snacks to school to ensure that they are peanut and nut-free.
- At the beginning of the year, teachers also sent home information regarding other anaphylactic allergies that are present in their classroom; we kindly ask you to double-check all items to ensure that they are allergy-safe.
- This includes bought lunches that enter the school; if your child's lunch contains an allergen they will be asked to eat it in the office with a friend.
- To help ensure student safety St. Padre Pio has a no foodsharing policy including celebrations in the classroom such as Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day, Birthdays, etc.
- Though many equate the idea of celebrating with food and gift-giving giving, we ask that all families adhere to our policy of non-food treats.
- Alternative items could include the following non-food items:
 - Pencils, Erasers, Stickers, Notepads
 - Games
 - A donation of a book/toy/game to the classroom

By adhering to this policy, we can better ensure that we are protecting our students with allergies.


CANADIAN MULTICULTURAL INVENTORS MUSEUM
